

African Savannah



The African savannah is in central Africa. It is a dry grassy plain with few trees. Herds of elephants, wildebeests, zebras, and gazelles roam here looking for water and food. There are also ostriches, baboons, and many birds. Lions, cheetahs, hyenas and jackals hunt the herds. Many of the large mammals on the savannah are endangered due to too much hunting. The African savannah makes up a band across the central part of Africa. It is a dry plain dotted with trees and shrubs and is home to herds of elephants, wildebeests, zebras, and gazelles that migrate between the wet and dry season searching for water and food. There are also ostrich, baboons, meerkats and many birds. Large predators – lions, cheetahs, hyenas and jackals hunt the herds as they move across the savannah. Many of the large mammals on the savannah are endangered due to habitat loss and over-hunting.
