


Mammal Matching

Draw a line from the **Mammal** to the correct **Order** in which it belongs.



Order — Rodentia — Rodents with two gnawing teeth on top, weighing from a few ounces up to 50 pounds.

Order — Artiodactyla — Hooved mammals with long thin legs and split-hooves.



Order — Carnivora — Shapes and size can vary greatly, but they all are meat eaters with sharp canine teeth.




Rodentia

Draw a line from the **Carnivore** to the correct **Family** in which it belongs.




Family - Canidae: Canines have a long snout, large, pointed ears and long, bushy tails.

Family - Felidae: Felines have short noses and in profile, short faces. Their ears are smaller and rounder than canines.


Family - Mustelidae: Mustelids all have scent glands, but vary widely in their body shape and form.

Family - Ursidae: Ursids have rounded bodies with small, rounded ears and short tails. They vary in color from tan to black.


