Habitat

They are found in in fields and roadsides.

Description

The tiny, white flowers are grouped into flat-topped bunches at the top of the woolly stem. The grayish-green leaves are feathery and fern-like on the stem and have a strong smell. They bloom June through September. Also called, milfoil.

Taxonomic Features (Traits) for Identification:

Flower Type: Tiny flowers regular with 5 petals growing in clusters on top of the plant (corymb shape)

Flower Color: White or pinkish

Leaf Arrangement: Alternate

Plant Type: Wildflower

Leaf Type: Lance-shaped and feathery
